As I write this, October is nearly finished. November is knocking at the door. And around here in our area, November brings with it late fall and trees shedding their leaves. It usually becomes somewhat rainier here as well. And, as November marches past, we usually notice quite a change in temperatures. So with these things said, I have a few comments to hopefully help you stay a little safer as you ride in the month ahead.

First, watch for leaves on the roadway while you ride. The leaves can be a pleasant sight of fall, but they can also be very dangerous, especially if there is any moisture involved. Damp leaves on a roadway can be very slick. Pay close attention as you negotiate your way through them, especially in curves. It makes for a really bad day if the bike wants to slide out from under you.

Secondly, be aware that the weather is changing and the days are getting much shorter. This will be painfully obvious after November 4th when we lose daylight saving time and revert back to standard time. You should take more jacket/layers than you think you need when going out for those afternoon rides just in case you stray farther from home than you intended and end up riding home in the dark. It gets cold quickly this time of year. The wind chill factor is real. So, just take some extra layers with you to keep yourself warm if you happen to be out later than you originally planned.

TECH 101: To GPS or Not to GPS, that is the Question! Jim Ferguson

I'm sure you remember the days of going on road trips, with your parents. Those were the days of sleeping on the rear dash of the car, or maybe the back seat if you had a small family. The days before mandatory seat belts, and child car seats.

Usually as part of that trip planning you might recall seeing the Auto Club flip maps, one of those collapsible folding maps, or the oversized Rand McNally map book. Someone drove while someone else in the car navigated using one of the aforementioned maps. Back then everybody learned to read a map if they were expected to drive or navigate, from one place to another. The only commands to turn here or there came from the navigating passenger in the car.

Fast forward to today, and our cars and motorcycles, have more tech than the space shuttles. Gone are the folding maps, those are replaced by in-dash navigation systems, Boom Infotainment systems, or the trusty handlebar mounted Garmin systems. But should paper maps really be gone from our trips? Personally, I still carry current maps in my vehicles. I guess I just can't let go of the old school maps...I need something to back up the tech I also depend on too much so sometimes! When I am not familiar with the roads to my destination, I will take some time and Google the route. I may also print the route and check it against my map book, just so I have some idea of the route to my destination. Just as a precaution mind you!

But what happens when count on our GPS systems too much?

When the Chapter plans a ride usually the head Road Captain, or someone in the club, uses an application like Garmin's Basecamp, or the Harley Ride planner, to map out the route to the ride destination. We share the routes and load them into our navigation devices. Then we schedule the Kicks Stand Up (KSU) time and prepare to meet and head out for the ride.

But anyone who has built a route, or been on rides know even the best route builders can run into direction challenges.

Back over the week leading up to the Labor Day holiday a handful of Chapter members headed off to Milwaukee for the 115th Harley-Davidson Anniversary celebration. Two different groups headed to Milwaukee, mostly using pre-made routes leading to Milwaukee from different directions. Once we all linked up at the hotel we rode to scheduled events trying to use our navigation units. However, the entire time we were in Milwaukee we all had GPS issues. It never failed that the nav system would tell you to keep moving left, and the next moment tell you to turn right.

Milwaukee is a unique town where you may come up to an intersection on the Interstate and there could be many roads that split into separate directions. The Boom nav units were constantly recalculating and it didn't take long to realize that we had to not depend on the Nav system so much and just follow the highway signs. Once we studied the city maps and figured out the roads the navigation units mostly played a backup roll.

When touring you should always have a backup plan. On the way home from Milwaukee my Boom Nav system kept going out. I was riding alone and if I hadn't been on a road I was familiar with I might have been in trouble! Knowing the route I was taking was my backup plan and I was able to get home without the navigation system. But in the case where you are not familiar, with the route, have a printed map handy.

So the moral of my story is don't always rely on the navigation units. It's a good idea to go "old school" and carry a paper copy of the route with you. You should always review your route and know the roads that you are taking to your destination and back again.

How many times have you "really" counted on your GPS, either the Garmin or the Boom Infotainment system to get you to where you were going?



It cost \$12 Billion to get the 24 GPS satellites up into orbit and another \$1 Billion a year to maintain the US GPS system. This is the satellite system that not only navigates us around but also manages the world's time clocks. These satellites circle the Earth twice a day, at 14k km/hr and at an altitude of 12,550 miles above the earth's surface. GPS satellites are not in geosynchronous or geostationary orbits, meaning they are not in synch with the earth's orbit. The UNITED STATES owns the most complete GPS system in the world. However, other countries do own some GPS satellites or are in the process of developing their own GPS satellite systems.

Join the local Memphis HOG Chapter


Download the Memphis HOG form and fill it out. There are three ways to submit the form;


