





It is entitled *George Harrison: Living in the Material World.* Yes, the late George Harrison of Beatle fame who went on to have a very successful solo career. The book, which was just published this year, draws from Harrison's own photographs, letters, diaries and memorabilia. It is also now the subject of an HBO documentary film directed by Martin Scorsese.

I learned that in 1970 Harrison purchased a home, Friar Park, which had previously been owned by Sir Frank Crisp. Crisp, an English lawyer and microscopist, lived there until his death in 1919. Harrison was impressed by the writings of Crisp and used them as a basis for several of his songs. He wrote a song called "Ballad of Sir Frankie Crisp (Let It Roll)" which appears on the album *All Things Must Pass*. The lyrics and title of another Harrison track, "The Answer's at the End" were also inspired by the writing of Frank Crisp.

Scan not a friend with a microscopic glass. You know his faults now let his foibles pass. Life is one long enigma my friend. So read on, read on, the answer's at the end.

Harrison states that this advice 'helped me actively to ease up on whosoever I thought I loved. It gave me the consciousness not to hang onto the negative side of it, to be more forgiving.'

That is something I imagine we all could profit from - to ease up on those we love and not scan their faults with that microscopic glass.

For as Harrison also said:

Now the darkness only stays at night time In the morning it will fade away Daylight is good at arriving at the right time No it's not always going to be this gray All things must pass

And now as this year nears its end I want to wish all of you a very Merry Christmas and a glorious New Year. It has been a privilege to have served as Chaplain this year.
